* Ingermanson believes that this 50:1 estimate is an upper favorability for this set of assumptions; so he states that his could be as much as 500:1 against the proposition.

** Ingermanson's estimate partially accepts (or rejects) assumptions "C" and "D". This is also true for assumption "E". However, that he has chosen as his primary result an estimate that weighted toward the rejection of "E".
